
Our School Growth Chart: This

card for the 2007-2008 school year contains important information about our school, including the details about our academic performance, teacher qualifications, learning environment, and more.

About Our School: J.B. McNabb Middle School is located in Mt. Sterling, Kentucky and serves approximately one thousand students in grades six through eight. McNabb Middle School is organized according to the "school within a school" concept, having six interdisciplinary teams. This offers students an opportunity to enjoy smaller school benefits while being in a large school. The staff and administration are dedicated and committed to helping students develop academic, social and behavioral skills necessary for success in high school and their adult pursuits. McNabb Middle School provides numerous opportunities for students to pursue their interests and develop personal skills by providing an extensive variety of extra-curricular activities.

How Our School Ensures

Educational Equity: The goal of the school is to provide for the specific instructional needs of each child. The school offers programs for students with special needs, including resource and collaborative classes, remediation classes in reading and math, and accelerated classes for students capable of performing at higher levels. The school provides opportunities for all students to participate in extra curricular programs emphasizing various sports, the arts and leadership. In addition, the school works collaboratively with community agencies such as Pathways, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, local businesses, the Mt. Sterling/Montgomery County Parks and Recreation, the Mt. Sterling/Montgomery County Council for the Arts and other organizations in providing services for the students at McNabb Middle School.

How We Are Doing

Kentucky uses the Commonwealth Accountability Testing System(CATS) to hold schools accountable for student progress. CATS has three parts: the Kentucky Core Content Tests, readiness tests by grade level, and other measures of the school's performance, including attendance, retention and dropout rates. Together these three elements make up a school's CATS Performance Score for every two-year period. The goal is that by 2014 nearly all students will score proficient or distinguished.

Kentucky Core Content Tests:

Kentucky's tests rate student performance as either Novice, Apprentice, Proficient, or Distinguished. These categories translate into a scale of 0-140, with 100 being considered proficient. This chart compares our school's performance with the schools in our district and throughout Kentucky. How We Use Technology to Teach: All teachers are required to meet Kentucky's technology standards as part of their formative and summative evaluations. Teachers use computers for research, internet, e-mail, portfolios, word-processing, web-design, spread sheet formats, publishing and STI. Students have the opportunity to have technology classes and gain a proficient knowledge of computers. Our school implemented the research based READ 180 program for reading intervention. Additional supplemental technology programs include Accelerated Reading and Accelerated Math programs, PLATO, and Study Island.

There is also a wide selection of clubs and programs that are available for students including FCA, Yearbook, Speech and Drama, Academic Team, Band, Chorus, Beta Club, KUNA, KYA, Builder's Club, Intramural Sports and STLP.

What We Are Doing To Improve: McNabb Middle School has a focus on establishing a climate conducive to effective teaching and learning. Strategies range from providing constant supervision to implementing school-wide expectations for behavior. Instructionally, teachers focus on effective, core content related instruction and assessment strategies while efficiently using all available instructional time. Emphasis is placed on utilizing hands-on instructional activities.
