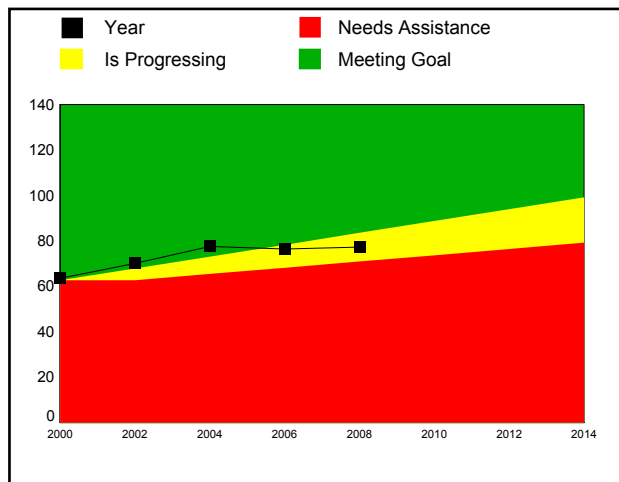

Dear Parents/Guardians: This report card for the 2007-2008 school year contains important information about our school, including the details about our academic performance, teacher qualifications, learning environment, and more.

About Our School: The mission of Camargo Elementary School is total commitment to high student achievement. We, the staff, students, parents, district personnel and community of Camargo Elementary School work cooperatively to ensure that all students gain a foundation to become life long learners. Programs offered at Camargo include preschool, all-day kindergarten, gifted/talented classes, special education, Title I Reading, Reading Intervention, Accelerated Reader and Math, Character Education, before and after school daycare, and a computer lab. We are located three miles south of the Mt. Sterling By-Pass on Highway 460. We take pride in the history of our school.

How Our School Ensures

Educational Equity: Camargo takes pride in meeting the diverse challenges of our students. We identify gaps in achievement by an analysis of assessment data, then use results of the analysis to develop specific intervention and differentiation strategies to be used in the classroom. The Family Resource Center, Title I, Migrant, ESS, and Preschool programs work together to reduce barriers and ensure all students are provided equal opportunity for learning and for success.

How We Are Doing

Kentucky uses the Commonwealth Accountability Testing System (CATS) to hold schools accountable for student progress. CATS has three parts: the Kentucky Core Content Tests, readiness tests by grade level, and other measures of the school's performance, including attendance, retention and dropout rates. Together these three elements make up a school's CATS Performance Score for every two-year period. The goal is that by 2014 nearly all students will score proficient or distinguished.

Kentucky Core Content Tests:

Kentucky's tests rate student performance as either Novice, Apprentice, Proficient, or Distinguished. These categories translate into a scale of 0-140, with 100 being considered proficient. This chart compares our school's performance with the schools in our district and throughout Kentucky. How We Use Technology to Teach: All students are scheduled to use the computer lab weekly. Accelerated Reader is available for all students. Accelerated Grammar and Spelling are used in grades 3-5. Accelerated Math and Math Facts in a Flash supplement math instruction. Airliners and smartboards are used to enhance instruction in classrooms. Art classes make use of computer programs to produce computer art, animation, and produce digital stories. Star Reading and Star Math are used to assess students. Students use Studyisland.com and ThinkLink Learning Practice Probes to review for KCCT.

Other Important Information About Our School

State Contest Results: Camargo takes great pride in the accomplishments of our students. Our Future Problem Solving Team placed 1st in District Governor's Cup competition and 2nd in Regionals competition. Overall, our Academic Team placed 2nd in District and 6th in Regional competition. Camargo's STLP Team earned recognition as a Gold Unit in Kentucky. The STLP Team had entries qualify for state competition with one student placing 1st in Digital Art.

Extracurricular Activities: Camargo offers a variety of extracurricular activities both during the school day and after school. They are beginning orchestra, Student Technology Leadership Program, BETA, Leadership, 4-H, Academic Team, Quick Recall Team, Future Problem Solving Team, Drama Club, and School Newspaper.

Awards & Recognitions: Awards and recognitions at Camargo include Principal's List, Honor Roll, Perfect Attendance, Triple Crown Award, Citizenship Award, District and Regional Governor's Cup Awards, and STLP Gold School Award.

What We Are Doing To Improve: Staff members have participated in professional development addressing areas of differentiation, varied assessments, and new programs have been implemented. The staff conducts learning checks to monitor students progress, ThinkLink PAS assessments are given 3 times a year, Study Island KCCT Prep has been purchased for Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies, and ESS tutoring is provided in Reading, Writing, and Math.
