About Our School: J.B. McNabb Middle School is located in Mt. Sterling, Kentucky and serves approximately one thousand students in grades six through eight. McNabb Middle School is organized according to the "school within a school" concept, having six interdisciplinary teams. The administrative team includes a Principal, three Assistant Principals, and three Counselors. This offers students an opportunity to enjoy smaller school benefits while being in a large school. The staff and administration are dedicated and committed to helping students develop academic, social and behavioral skills necessary for success in high school and their adult pursuits. McNabb School provides numerous opportunities Middle for students pursue their interests and develop personal skills by providing an extensive variety of extra-curricular activities.

How We Ensure Educational Equity: The goal of the school is to provide for the specific instructional needs of each child. The school offers programs for students with special needs, including resource and collaborative classes, remediation classes in reading and math, and accelerated classes for students capable of performing at higher levels. The school provides opportunities for all students to participate in extra curricular programs emphasizing various sports, the arts and leadership. In addition, the school works collaboratively with community agencies such as Pathways, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, local businesses, the Mt. Sterling/Montgomery County Parks and Recreation, the Mt. - School Improvement Yr 1 (2 years not making AYP): Notify parents, implement school choice, and write or revise school plan.
- **School Improvement Yr 2** (3 years not making AYP): Notify parents, continue school choice, revise school plan, and offer supplemental services.
- **Corrective Action Yr 1** (4 years not making AYP): Notify parents, continue school choice, revise school plan, continue supplemental services, and implement corrective action.
- **Corrective Action Yr 2** (5 years not making AYP): Notify parents, continue school choice, revise school plan, continue supplemental services, continue corrective action and write a plan for Alternative Governance.
- **Restructuring** (6 years not making AYP): Notify parents, continue school choice, revise school plan, continue supplemental services, continue corrective action and implement Alternative Governance Plan.

State Assistance (Non-Title I)

Senate Bill I, signed into law in March 2009, requires state accountability for Non-Title I schools. If a non-Title I school does not make AYP in the same content area for two consecutive years, the school will be eligible for state assistance. The description "Eligible for State Assistance" will appear in the Consequences, School Status column, followed by the number "1" or "2" indicating the number of years eligible.

How We Are Doing

Kentucky's Interim School Testing and Accountability System has three parts: the Kentucky Core Content Tests (KCCT); readiness tests by grade level; and other measures of a school's performance, including attendance, retention and dropout rates. This interim system will be replaced in the 2011-12 school year by a new testing and accountability system structured as required by statute. The goal is that, by 2014, nearly all students will score proficient or distinguished in every subject area tested.
