Montgomery County High School has a student body that consists of approximately 1,315 students in grades 9-12. It is situated in the community of Mt. Sterling, Kentucky with a population of 6,959 and a county population of 27,643. There are four elementary schools and a single middle school that are providing students to our one high school. Montgomery County has a 76.7% of high school graduate or higher and 15.5% of a college bachelor degree or higher. The median income is \$37,393, persons below the poverty level is 23.2% as provided by the US Census Bureau. Mt. Sterling, KY, 30 miles east of Lexington, is the economic center of Montgomery County. Mt. Sterling's top industries include manufacturing, transportation and business services. Major employers range from Nestle, which makes its Hot Pocket and Lean Pocket products in Mt. Sterling, to automotive part suppliers. Mt. Sterling's quality of life attractions include golf, a regional arts center, a new hospital and a satellite campus for Morehead State University. Mt. Sterling/Montgomery County, a four-time 100 Best Community winner, was honored for its programs that offer young people service opportunities, access to extracurricular activities and a supportive educational environment. Giving back and serving the community is another priority for Mt. Sterling/Montgomery County. The SERVE student group is a high school organization that connects students with service activities, such as volunteering at local civic group banquets or programs. Additionally organizations including the Future Business Leaders of America, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, 4-H and ROTC offer students access to more community service learning projects.
